

**Learn:™ Rhythm Adult (Product #80-1471)
Frequently Asked Questions Document**

Q: What is Learn: Rhythm Adult?

A: Learn: Rhythm Adult is an online, self-directed course designed to introduce healthcare providers to normal cardiac rhythms and prepare them to recognize basic cardiac arrhythmias in clinical practice. To teach these skills, this course features a combination of audio, animation, interactive activities, and self-assessment portions.

Course content includes:

- Basic rhythm understanding
- Relationship between ECG strip and heart impulses
- Common arrhythmias
- Identifying and distinguishing various arrhythmias
- 2-part AHA exam

Q: Why did the American Heart Association develop Learn: Rhythm Adult?

A: According to the *2005 AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC*, ECG recognition is a key skill required to be successful in determining a patient's condition and knowing which algorithm to apply. This course allows healthcare providers to gain proficiency in ECG rhythm recognition in an effort to provide better patient treatment and save more lives.

Q: Who is the target audience for this course?

A: This course is designed for healthcare professionals needing basic rhythm recognition skills, telemetry staff, and those preparing for ACLS such as paramedics/EMTs, nurses, physicians, clinical pharmacists, and respiratory therapists. This course will also meet the needs of nurses, pharmacists, emergency medical services personnel and physicians seeking to obtain continuing education credits.

Q: Does this course offer a certification or credential?

A: No. Completion of this course does not result in an AHA course completion card. However, a certificate of completion is available for the student to print at the end of the course. Students may also apply for continuing education credits upon completion.

Q: What are the unique features and benefits of Learn: Rhythm Adult?

A: Below are some of the key features and benefits of this course:

- Improves decision-making skills in distinguishing specific cardiac rhythms and arrhythmias No skills session required

Q: Is a skills session required?

A: No.

Q: How long does this course take to complete?

A: On average, this course will take students approximately 4 ½ hours to complete.

Q: Is there a score that must be achieved by students in order to successfully pass this course?

A: Yes. There are two parts to the exam. A score of 84% or better in both parts is required to pass the course and receive a completion certificate.

Q: How many attempts does a student have to pass the completion exam?

A: A student has up to three attempts to successfully complete the Learn: Rhythm Adult exam. If the student fails to pass within three tries, he/she will need to purchase a new license to attempt completion of the exam again.

Q: Are there continuing education credits available for this course?

A: Yes, the following continuing education credits are available:
